




What is E-hailing?

- Many DTS providers have apps




E-hailing taxis was increasingly popular before the pandemic

ALCOHOL



 Alcohol delivery permitted when a part of a restaurant's prepared food order.
Not from liquor stores.

➤Must be in in sealed containers.

It is illegal to possess an alcoholic beverage in an open container in a vehicle.

Rules While Driving



➤Turn meter and dome light off when while delivering food.

Cannot transport other passengers while carrying prepared food.

Exception for grocery store packages that does not contain prepared food.


Prevent Auto Thefts
