7	Chambers, One Judiciary Square. It's
8	Wednesday, May 14th. The time is now at
9	10:05.
10	As is our custom, I would like to
11	call to order and have a moment of silence in
12	honor of those who have given their lives in
13	the service of their community and their
14	country.
15	Thank you.
16	The Secretary will determine a
17	quorum and before she does, let me call to
18	your attention and for the record that a
19	change in the statute adopted over a year ago
20	provides that the Chairman would select the
21	Secretary of the Commission who had by statute
22	and by regulation been the General Counsel.

1	The change was made because of the amount of
2	work on the General Counsel and the legal
3	aspect and finally, we changed the regulations
4	with the recent publication.
5	And so, we've come to the point
6	where the Chairman may now officially appoint
7	a Secretary to the Commission and I'm going to
8	issue an executive order this coming
9	sometime today or tomorrow naming Juanda Mixon
10	as the Secretary of the Commission. She has,
11	as you know, been the Acting Secretary for
12	some time and it's, I think, time that we made
13	her officially the Secretary.
14	So, we welcome you, Ms. Mixon, as
15	our new Secretary and will the Secretary
16	please call the roll for determination of a
17	quorum.

21	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: That's a
22	meeting of the Panel on Industry. Correct?

3	Commissioner Burns, any
4	COMMISSIONER BURNS: No comments
5	at this time.
6	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Commissioner
7	Crocker.
8	COMMISSIONER CROCKER: Yes,
9	Chairman, I would like to applaud you on your
10	excellent selection of the Secretary.
11	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Thank you
12	very much and I was wondering why I didn't
13	hear any applause from the announcement, but
14	there we go. One of the few people on the
15	Commission that repeatedly gets compliments
16	from the constituencies we serve.
17	The next item on our agenda is
18	Commission Action Items and the Commission has
19	no pending action items to consider at this
20	meeting. So, we'll move on.
21	Is there any Government
22	Communications or Presentations, Madam

2	MS. MIXON: No Government
3	Communications.
4	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Then we have
5	the General Counsel's Report. Is the General
6	Counsel prepared to make a report at this
7	time?
8	MR. LERNER: I am, Chairman. I
9	have an update on Commission Actions that have
10	been taken so far this calendar year following
11	the general meeting on March 12th.
12	On April 4th, the Commission
13	published final rules to make the Secretary as
14	designed by the Commission and updated certain
15	administrative fees charged for services
16	provided by the Office of Taxicabs
17	establishing late fees and vehicle fees.
18	On April 11th, Commission
19	published final rules raising fines on payment
20	service companies that provide the MTS
21	systems, establishing fines for failing to
22	provide necessary trip data.

1	
	Page 8
1	The same day, also published were
2	published for the second time emergency and
3	proposed rules to clarify the fee between DDSs
4	and PSP businesses and adjust other fees that
5	were not set by the earlier rules.
6	On April 18th, the Commission
7	published for the third time proposed rules to
8	create a new Chapter 7 establishing
9	comprehensive and uniform rules for due
10	process and enforcement for the entire Title
11	31 and streamlining the process for public
12	complaints.
13	On April 25th, the Commission
14	published for the second time emergency and
15	proposed rules requiring taxicab companies to
16	pay rental drivers within 24 hours or one
17	business day the amounts that they are owed
18	under the new credit card systems and that's
19	the same amount same requirement as for
20	independent drivers who own their own cars and
21	imposing the same fine \$1,000.
22	On May 2nd, the Commission

1	published proposed rules to address various
2	compliance issues including requirements for
3	double seals on meters and functions of dome
4	lights.
5	The same day, the Commission
6	published proposed rules to address compliance
7	issues involving payment service providers.
8	On May 2nd, the Commission
9	published final rules for Chapter 16 which
10	established minimal requirements for digital
11	dispatch services requiring them to come into
12	the Office of Taxicabs to register so that the
13	office is aware of who's in business in the
14	City and provide a demonstration of their
15	handheld for technical and enforcement
16	purposes and I believe at this time, five of
17	the 60 DDSs in the District are registered.
18	On May 9th, the Commission
19	published the first of a two-part publication
20	of its first proposed rulemakings to create a
21	new class of public vehicle for hire service:
22	private sedan services. There are six

1	there will be six chapters altogether.
2	Chapters 8, 12 and 14 were published that
3	day.
4	Chapter 8 deregulates taxicab
5	fares for rides booked by DDSs. Allows the
6	DDS to set the entire fare which is the same
7	as for black cars and for proposed private
8	sedan services. That does not apply to street
9	hail rides.
10	It makes conforming changes in
11	Chapter 12 which currently refers to black
12	cars as sedans and throughout that chapter,
13	the references will now be to black cars.
14	And under Chapter 14, it
15	integrates the operation of proposed private
16	sedans into the existing rules for what will
17	now be called black cars.
18	Those are the regulatory actions
19	that have been taken to date this year.
20	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Thank you,
21	Mr. General Counsel. Does any Commissioner
22	have a question for the General Counsel?

3	We do have additional staff
4	reports for the Commission. At this time, I
5	would like to ask the Acting Administrator for
6	the Office of Taxicabs Ms. McInnis to make a

8	a procedural vote on acceptance or rejection
9	of what she's about to show us.
10	MS. MCINNIS: Good morning. I'm
11	going to present to you a diagram and it's for
12	the new logo for the D.C. Taxicab Commission.
13	Chairman has informed me that the

15	morning hopefully. So, I will just pass that
16	out.
17	I should add that this logo will
18	be utilized in the new building that we are
19	anticipating occupying on Shannon Place.
20	They're going to actually have it set up in
21	the reception area on the second floor and the
22	third floor and additionally, it could be used

3	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Is there a
4	reason why they can't see it while you're
5	talking about it?
6	MS. MCINNIS: Yes, I'm going to
7	give it to them now. You can pass out and you
8	will know you can just give them. On this
9	what I'm giving you now, it's rated it
10	resembles the same color scheme as the new
11	taxicab with the the swoosh on there looks
12	a little bluish, but I guarantee you it will
13	be silver. The same silver color that's used
14	on the taxicabs. So, it'll be red and silver
15	on a white background.
16	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: And am I
17	correct, Ms. McInnis, that this design came
18	from our designer that we contracted with to
19	do the other designs?
20	MS. MCINNIS: That is correct.
21	The same designer that did the vehicles is the
22	same person that came up with this clarified

Page 13 1 design. There were a number of others that 2 3 we looked at, but a consensus was reached that this one would transfer across all types of 4 medium. You can't -- because right now, 5 6 you're looking at a color version, but you want to depict something that would also 7 transfer in black and white and look equally 8 9 as well. So, that's what some of the thought 10 process that went into picking this particular 11 design. CHAIRPERSON LINTON: 12 Before I open 13 it up for discussion, is there a motion to 14 adopt? 15 COMMISSIONER CROCKER: Moved. 16 CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Support? 17 COMMISSIONER BURNS: Second. 4	another exam April 26 and we tested 372
5	applicants and of that lot, 268 passed the
6	exam.
7	That brings to a total, Mr.
8	Chairman, 2,828 people has passed the
9	licensing examination since we began the
10	process in late 2013 and of that lot, you
11	should know that 504 have actually come in and
12	received or had new face cards issued to them.
13	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: How many?
14	MR. SPARKS: Five hundred and
15	four. Okay.
16	On the enforcement front, I'm
17	pleased to announce that our two new hack
18	inspector recruits have successfully completed
19	their formalized training consisting of
20	certified classroom training and field
21	training to the extent of 400-plus hours.
22	They're now out in the street with

1	the rest of our inspectors. That brings to a
2	total of 14 inspectors who are out there
3	conducting driver surveys and compliance
4	surveys to make sure that our drivers and
5	their vehicles are in compliance with Title
6	31.
7	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Thank you,
8	Chief Sparks.
9	MR. SPARKS: That's my report,
10	sir.
11	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Does any
12	member of the Commission have any questions
13	for Chief Sparks or any comments they wish to
14	make? Commissioner.
15	COMMISSIONER SMALLS: I would like
16	to know what I would just like to know type
17	of preparation are you giving these taxi
18	drivers before they take the exam about the
19	history of the City? Because they don't seem
20	to know anything about the monuments or any
21	points of interest in the City.
22	When I go to foreign countries and

1	other cities, the taxicab drivers are very
2	knowledgeable.
3	What are you doing here?
4	MR. SPARKS: Well, Commissioner,
5	the formalized training is provided by three
6	accredited institutions and there is a well-
7	defined curriculum. I don't know all of the
8	topics in the curriculum, but I do imagine
9	that's one of the topics that is covered and
10	that they're tested on. But, I certainly will
11	confirm that for additional information about
12	that if you need
13	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Let me answer
14	that. The Office of Taxicabs Commissioner,
15	I would recall to you that the Office of
16	Taxicabs did have under the requirement of the
17	statute a firm that developed under our
18	guidance a curriculum that meets the
19	requirements of the statutes that includes
20	what you're talking about. That we have
21	accredited three institutions that offer a
22	two-week course that is mandatory if they want

2	all of these have gone through that course and
3	part of that curriculum is knowing the City.
4	Commissioner Burns, you had a
5	question.
6	COMMISSIONER BURNS: Yes. Good
7	morning.
8	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Is your mike
9	on? When we get in our own building, it's
10	going to be a lot easier.
11	COMMISSIONER BURNS: How about
12	now? Okay. You mentioned 2800 people have
13	taken the test.
14	MR. SPARKS: Yes, sir.
15	COMMISSIONER BURNS: Now, is that
16	refresh my memory. Is this a yearly test?
17	Is this an every three-year test? Is this
18	what is the process for a taxi driver to have
19	the proper credentials and training or is this
20	a one-time testing?
21	MR. SPARKS: It's almost a monthly
22	exam. We give exams

1	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: No, that's
2	not the question. They have to present their
3	certificate of completion for the training.
4	COMMISSIONER BURNS: Right.
5	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: They go to
6	one of these three institutions they select.
7	They take the training. They get a
8	certificate of completion. Then they're
9	eligible to come in and take that test.
10	COMMISSIONER BURNS: Right.
11	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: After they
12	take the test if they pass, they are then
13	eligible for to apply for a hack license or a
14	sedan, a limousine license or a universal
15	license. That is all three.
16	They go through their background
17	check. Clearing that and paying their fee,
18	they then get their license.
19	Under the statute, I would remind
20	you, Commissioner, that those who already are
21	licensed are now required to have a refresher
22	course before each renewal of their license.

2	COMMISSIONER BURNS: Which occurs
3	how often?
4	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Well, it'll
5	be most of them renew every two years.
6	COMMISSIONER BURNS: Okay. Thank
7	you.

9	they can renew the next time, they will have
10	to show completion of that refresher course.
11	We're in the process of setting up the process
12	by which the refresher course will be given
13	and will be mandated.
14	COMMISSIONER BURNS: Thank you.
15	MR. SPARKS: Thank you, Mr.
16	Chairman.
17	CHAIRPERSON LINTON: Any other
18	questions? If not, that completes the staff
19	reports.
20	We'll move on now to the public
21	comment period and we do have a member of the
22	public Mr. Al Parker. Is Mr. Parker with us?
