RENEWAL OF LICENSE/LATE FEES

A licensed operator of a public vehicle for hire may submit an application to renew the license to operate a public vehicle for hire forty-five (45) days before the expiration of the license.

If an applicant fails to submit an application to renew the license to operate a public vehicle for hire prior to the expiration, the following Late Penalties will apply:

- (a) Within one (1) to fifteen (15) days after the expiration date of the license, the person shall pay a late penalty of twenty-five dollars (\$25):
- (b) Within sixteen (16) to thirty (30) days following the expiration date of the license, the person shall pay a late penalty of fifty dollars (\$50); and
- (c) Within thirty-one (31) to forty-five (45) days after the expiration date of the license, the person shall pay a late penalty of one hundred dollars (\$100).

If an applicant fails to submit an application to renew the license to operate a public vehicle for hire within forty-five (45) days after the expiration date of the license, the person shall pay a late penalty of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) and shall be required to take and successfully complete the operator training course before being eligible for license renewal.

If the applicant fails to submit an application to renew the license to operate a public vehicle for hire within one (1) year after the expiration date of the license, the person shall be required to apply for a new license to operate a public vehicle for hire pursuant to the provisions of Title 31.

Also note that the Residency Requirement still applies for all renewals.
